BACKGROUND: Vice Mayor Jean Quan, a 30-year Oakland resident, has dedicated her 20 years as a school board member and city council member to making government work for its residents. Her hallmark as an elected official is open, transparent communications and linking people to resources, empowering residents to make changes in their neighborhoods. A recognized leader of state and national urban advocacy organizations for urban education reform, environmental policies and green city planning, Jean has led many local efforts to create policy and institutions that help Oakland youth, seniors and families thrive.

For the past year, she has met with more than 1000 residents in house parties throughout the city to hear Oaklander's concerns and priorities for the next mayor. The Campaign Kickoff celebrates the growing community support for Jean Quan for Oakland Mayor 2010. When elected to the City Council in 2002, Jean Quan was the first Asian American Woman Council Member in Oakland. She will be the first woman mayor of Oakland and the first Asian American mayor of a major US City.
